	Course Name	Beginning Korean Language with K-Culture

	Course Description	<p>This four-week-course is specially designed for students who have no or little knowledge of Korean to acquire four skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing) of the basic Korean language through Korean Culture. Each day will consist of 3 hours of lecture and activity sessions. Students will learn one aspect of Korean culture (music, poem, art, history, custom, food, short story, etc.) each day and gain the foundation of the Korean alphabet, grammar, vocabulary, and expressions related to these cultural themes during the lecture. Then, they will practice the learned knowledge in pairs or in small groups during the activity sessions. Further practice opportunities are given during after class hours using online tools and projects. Through these real-life-oriented practices and using authentic materials, students will be able to create with the language and apply the learned knowledge to the real world.</p>				
	Course Objective	<p>The goal of this course is to be exposed to Korean culture, master the Korean writing system (Hangul), to be able to read and write Korean, and to acquire survival skills.
