	<b>Course Description</b>	<p><b>Cap. of Enrollment:</b> 20</p> <p>This four-week course is specially designed for students with little or no knowledge of Korean, aiming to help them acquire the basic skills (listening, speaking, reading, and writing) of the Korean language through the exploration of Korean culture. Each day will consist of three hours of lecture and activity sessions. During the lectures, students will learn and establish a foundation in the Korean alphabet, grammar, vocabulary, and expressions related to cultural themes. Subsequently, they will have the opportunity to practice what they have learned in pairs or small groups during the activity sessions. Further practice opportunities will be provided through online tools and projects outside of class hours. Through these real-life-oriented practices, students will be able to create using the language and apply the knowledge they have acquired to real-world situations.</p>				
	<b>Course Objective</b>	<p>The goal of this course is to expose students to Korean culture, master the Korean writing system (Hangul), develop the ability to read and write Korean, and acquire survival skills.
