Course Description	<p>This course is a continuation of Korean 1. Using the natural approach, this course stresses vocabulary and fundamental sentence structure in the past and future indicative tenses in the subjunctive mode. Basic aural and reading comprehension is also developed. Students will hold simple conversations, learn common sayings, and write short compositions about the past and future actions. Readings of simplified texts and study of Korean culture are included.</p>

Understand Korean culture and history as incorporated through Korean language
