	<b>Course Description</b>	<p>According to World Bank, people with living expenses less than 2\$ per day are regarded as living in the absolute poverty level. They suffer from low income, lack of basic medical and educational services, inadequate safe water and hygiene facilities, insufficient energy and electricity, and so on. In addition, the degree and speed of development vary from country to country, and the gap in development between countries is considerable. To address these social problems, the international community has been cooperating in various ways to eradicate poverty and achieve sustainable development. International development cooperation is one of them. In order to grasp the core concepts, this course will overview history, patterns and trend, various methods/approaches of development cooperation and discuss the effectiveness of international development cooperation. The first half of the course will focus on theories in international development, while the latter half will focus on recent trends, actors in development cooperation and group activities.</p>
